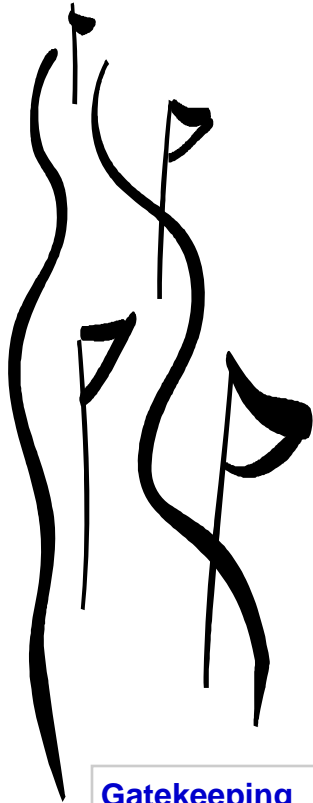

Gatekeeping

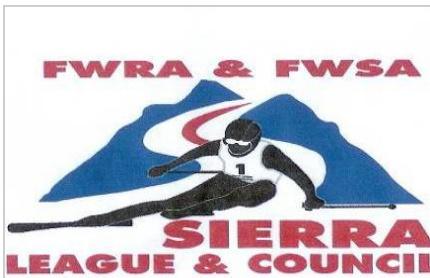

Carving Cup Race, RESCHEDULED to March 14th

Check out Carving Cup racing March 14 at Northstar

The Sierra League is holding the rescheduled Carving Cup race Sunday, March 14 at Northstar. This is the day after slalom race at Diamond Peak, so you can make a weekend of interesting races. Carving Cup allows Sierra League and Council members and guests to enjoy something new and different on the snow that weekend.

What to expect on March 14 at Northstar?

Morning registration will occur at the regular place in the village at 8am. It will be closed by 9am. We also hope to be able to register drop in racers at the start arena later. Late drop-ins will have to sign the liability waivers, pay cash, and will be added to the end of the start list. Registration on the hill closes after the practice run. Registration fee will be \$10 and free for Sierra season race pass holders.

For the past season and a half, I've been trying to organize a Carving Cup race for Sierra. Carving Cup gained its popularity in Europe in the late 90s, when first Elan "parabolics" and then other brands' "shaped" skis allowed skiers to carve perfect arcs on the snow. FIS sponsored international races attract national teams from up to a dozen of countries. The most active countries, who host major Carving Cup events, are Italy and Poland.

What makes Carving Cup different from other Alpine disciplines? A lot!

First, the course.

It is set with buoys instead of gates. Think of water slalom. But in every turn there may be from one to three buoys. In every turn you make a choice which buoy to ski around. Blue is usually is an inside one. Red is outside, which makes you ski wider. Yellow is in between.

Second, the scoring.

It is not just the time of your run, but also points. When you clear a Blue buoy, you get 3 points. A Yellow buoy nets you 4 points and a red 5 points. All the points in each turn are added to your total points value. The winner has the smallest ratio of time divided by total points. If you ski wider, it takes longer, but gives more points. Figure it out! In the two runs race the best run counts.

Third, the equipment.

You don't need speed suits, protective gear, and poles. Actually all of these are not allowed on the course, just ski in your comfortable ski clothes.

Why this format should be good for recreational racing? I think it has a number of advantages.

The course is usually set on a flat hill with 8 - 12 turns. The speeds are low. The course is not intimidating and scary for any level of skiers. To do well, you just have to do clean turns. Snowboarders on carving boards have no disadvantage compared to skiers. Carving Cup is a great opportunity to attract kids and families. Because of slow speeds, the course holds better. Especially if set on hard packed man-made snow.

The course should be set by 9am and opened for inspection only for 20 minutes. At 9:30am we plan to give everyone a practice run in the start order. The race runs will start at 10:30am. There will be no rotation in the start order. It will be the same for all runs.

The start order will be the following:

Legends women, Jr women, Vet women, Open women, Legends men, Jr men, Vet men, Open men.

There will be no class levels nor snow board vs. skier class differences.

The start order within each class will be based on registration order.

Register earlier - get earlier start.



We will need several teams of volunteers.

Registration - Both in the village and in the start arena.

Gatekeepers with walkie-talkies. One or two in the start arena. Two on the course. Two in the finish arena. One at the scoreboard.

Data entry on the laptop. The Northstar Race Department will provide coaches to set and restore the course, a starter, and a person to work the timer. But since scoring involves visual point counting, data entry becomes crucial.

Sierra League awards will be given at the lodge after the race. We were cancelled in December 2008 for lack of snow and December 2009 for too much snow! We managed to set up a demo course during the FWRA Championships at Northstar last April, where quite a few people had fun and a taste of this type of race. We are excited about the carving cup race in March, when the Northstar Race Department together with Sierra League will host our first race in the new format.
