Old Article II

ARTICLE II: OFFICERS

Section 1. The Executive Board shall consist of the following elected officers: president, vice president, treasurer, secretary, head gatekeeper, vice president-travel, newsletter editor and web master. The immediate past president shall be an ex-officio member with voting privileges. The Executive Board may designate any additional appointive, non-voting officers they deem necessary. Any appointed officers shall serve at the pleasure of the Board and shall include race practice director.

New Article II

ARTICLE II: OFFICERS

Section 1. The Executive Board shall consist of the following elected officers: president, vice president, treasurer, secretary, head gatekeeper, vice president-travel, newsletter editor and web master. The immediate past president shall be an ex-officio member with voting privileges for *one year*. The Executive Board may designate any additional appointive, non-voting officers they deem necessary. Any appointed officers shall serve at the pleasure of the Board and shall include race practice director.

Newsletter to go electronic: It is the decision of the board to switch to electronic distribution of the newsletter. The newsletter will be posted on the league web page each month. E-mail notification of the new issue with a direct web-link is planned. When filling out your race waiver, please make sure your email address is correct and legible. Race Registration

Now that we are experiencing fall weather and winter is just around the corner, we are beginning to think about skiing and racing.

Your Sierra League Board of Directors is considering a new **on-line registration** procedure to facilitate race day sign-ups for season pass holders. This will be a very good reason for you to purchase your season passes to gain this important benefit! **Paul Laudenschlager, Pavel Bosin, and Dan Jeffrey** are considering questions such as: What do we do about securing gatekeepers? How will we handle the waivers each race area requires on race day? How can we notify racers of last minute race day changes?

Race Passes: *Due Dec 6* Your race pass fees will remain the same as last year. That is **\$100** for eight races plus the refundable **\$20** gatekeeping fee. This is a substantial savings over paying for each individual race day.

Clubs: 1. Collect \$120 from each racer; 2. Collect completed & signed Sierra League Release Forms from each racer; 3. Send **one** check made out to **Sierra League** for **all** of your racers; 4. Send the check and all Release Forms to Sierra League Treasurer: **Frank App**, 526 Wolf Tree, Truckee, CA 96161.

New FWRA Championship Rules

1. New S0 class with 0-18.99 handicap. Anyone with 2 handicaps below 19.00 over the past two seasons will be placed in the S0 class. S1 is now 19-25.99 handicap. S0 class will include men & woman of any age. Top five positions will receive awards in S0 class.
2. New point system. 25, 20, 17, 15 ... Up to 18 people can earn points in each class. All finishers will receive one point.
3. Awards will be given to the first three positions in every class, no matter how many are in class.
4. No going through the gates during course inspection. (May not cross the plane of the gate while side-slipping.)
5. You must race in the skill class your best two handicaps put you in. No more self-bumping of skill class. Racers may still self-bump from Vet to Open age class.
6. Start order for each class: Junior Women, Junior Men, Vet Women, Vet Men, Open Women, Open Men.
7. Break between SNOB1 and SNOB2 moved from 100 point handicap to 80 point.
8. Race Bibs must be visible from front and rear during course inspection (this rule WILL BE strictly enforced).

Winter Travel Safety Tips:

1. Keep the top half of the gas tank full. It can give better traction and gives a bigger margin of error if you get stuck and need to keep the engine running periodically to keep warm.
2. If stuck in a storm, do not leave your car. Run the engine periodically and wait for help.
3. Carry blankets, water, a flashlight, a shovel, nutrition bars or even candy bars for sustenance. Winterize your vehicle's safety kit by including extra blankets, sand to help gain traction if stuck on ice or snow, jumper cables, an ice scraper and lock de-icer.
4. Remember that 4-wheel drive does not mean 4-wheel stop. A 4-wheel drive vehicle will not stop any better in icy conditions.
5. Remember to carry chains and that they are the correct size for you tires. Sierra snow conditions may mandate use of chains.
6. Be sure of your route. Don't go exploring in the back-country without some local knowledge, especially during a storm.
7. Be sure to have good tires. At least 1/8 of an inch tread depth is recommended. All season radials on a front-wheel-drive passenger vehicle are adequate for most situations. Snow tires on most rear wheel drive vehicles are usually adequate.
8. In poor visibility or even whiteout conditions, don't drive faster than you can see ahead. High speeds in poor or no visibility can lead to large chain reaction accidents. Remember you can't see around mountain curves and corners either.
9. In addition, respect winter weather, conduct a pre-trip inspection of your vehicle, leave extra space between your automobile and others on the road, and never drink and drive. Of course, always **buckle up!**
